A new bridge has been constructed where the creek eroded from flooding earlier this year, causing the old pathway to collapse. Concrete ramps still need to be put in place, but we are making progress! The damage to the other bridge is less severe (thankfully), but will still need a new support structure built to mitigate erosion and prevent complete collapse.

Dear cherished friends of Noah's Ark,

We write to you today with heartfelt gratitude and a sincere plea for your unwavering support.

As you know, our sanctuary relies solely on the generosity of compassionate individuals like you. Without any city, state, or federal funding, we face significant challenges as we strive to continue providing the best care for our beloved animal residents.

At present, we are confronted with a pressing issue that requires urgent attention—the need to fell damaged trees within the habitats of our majestic predators. However, before we can embark on this critical mission, we must first install larger gates in each habitat to bring in the necessary equipment to make the process as quick and efficient as possible.

To tackle this challenge head-on, we humbly appeal for your support.

We need to raise \$10,000 to install the necessary gates and fencing, and an additional \$25,000 to cover the costs of felling over two dozen damaged trees.

We are also looking for companies who would be willing to help us at a discount, with opportunities for sponsorship available.

These funds are vital in creating a safe haven for our cherished animals, allowing them to thrive in a protected and nurturing environment.

In addition to our immediate concerns, our pathways have suffered as well. The relentless force of the spring flood caused severe eroding of the creek bed and damage to crossings.
